# **Unit 1. Showing topic importance**

This unit introduces the language that helps authors show the importance of the topic or issue at hand.

Look at these examples. Note the expressions in bold that stress the importance of a topic or issue:

- 1. Venture capitalists have received notable attention in the academic literature.
- 2. Emerging technology has attracted great interest in the research on governance and non-state actors.
- 3. Technology-based agricultural practices are of growing importance to modern farmer-entrepreneurs.

## Common verbs in statements of 'need' and 'importance'

One can emphasize, highlight, point out, point to, stress, or underline a need for or importance of something.

To emphasize that the subject of research is important and worthy of attention, one can also say that it:

calls for/demands/requires	(special) attention
deserves/merits/warrants	(careful/close, etc.) consideration
necessitates/needs	(detailed/systematic, etc.) examination/investigation.
