Hong, Yun Geun is a senior researcher of the Fusion Center for Security and Disaster Safety of Konkuk University. He was the founding director of the Environment Liaison Centre in Kenya in 1975. He has traveled, lived, and worked in Asia, North America, Europe and Africa. He has visited North Korea seven times. He was born in Melbourne Australia; today he is a dual national of Australia and the United States. He is married with two children.

Evgeny Kanaev is a professor at School of International Regional Studies, National Research University Higher School of Economics, Leading Researcher, Center for Asia Pacific Studies, IMEMO RAS, Moscow, Russia. He is Doctor of Science (History) and Professor at School of International Regional Studies, National Research University Higher School of Economics, Moscow, Russia. He is also a Leading Researcher at Center for Asia Pacific Studies, Institute of World Economy and International Relations (IMEMO), Russian Academy of Sciences. Professor E. Kanaev is a member of Russian National Committee, the Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia Pacific (CSCAP). His area of research focuses upon security challenges and multilateral cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region, Russian regional priorities and policy. He is the author, co-author and editor of over 230 academic

papers published in Russia, the US, China Japan, the Republic of Korea, Singapore, Vietnam, India and European countries.

Wan, Yun (Ray Wang) is an associate professor in the Graduate Institute of East Asian Studies and the Institute of International Relations (IIR) at National Chengchi University, Taiwan. Ray has earned his political science Ph.D. in UC-Riverside and previously visiting in East China Normal University, Chinese University of Hong Kong, City University of Seoul, Purdue University, and other academic institutes. His research expertise is in transnational advocacy, human security, religious freedom, cross-Strait relations, and Chinese united front work. Now he also serves as the executive editor for the academic journal, *Mainland China Studies* (TSSCI indexed). His newest book, *Resistance Under Communist China: Religious Protesters, Advocates and Opportunists*, was published by Palgrave Macmillan (New York) in 2019.

Haruki, Ikumi is the executive director of Japan-Korea Cultural Exchange Fund. She received her Ph.D. from Doshisha University, Kyoto, Japan in Sociology. She was an associate professor at Department of Social Sciences, Toyo Eiwa University, and an invited researcher, Graduate School of Pacific Asia, Waseda University. Her publications in Japanese
